

During a recent Nebraska Admirals Association (NAA) Quarterly Board Meeting, the board members determined that we should provide (in the NAA newsletter) a thumbnail review of the minutes from the Quarterly Board Meetings so that members of the NAA could have a better understanding as to the efforts made by their board and encourage the members to provide comment and/or feedback.

With that decision in mind, below are the highlights from:

- The January 18, 2014 Nebraska Admirals Association (NAA) Quarterly Board Meeting, held at the Country Kitchen in York, NE.
- The April 5, 2014 Nebraska Admirals Association (NAA) Annual Board Meeting, held at the UNL East Campus Student Union in Lincoln, NE.

From January 18, 2014 NAA Board Meeting

Financial Report — The end-of-year Financial Report presented a comparison between 2012 & 2013 expenses, noting that the expenses for 2013 were higher than 2012, in each of the categories.

As dues were due January 1, 2014, a motion was passed to send out postcards to those members who have not yet paid their dues.

Annual Meeting Report — The final schedule for the NAA Annual Meeting: The Board Meeting will be at 9:00 followed by Registration at 11:00 and the Luncheon at 11:30. Alter the lunch, we will recognize our Scholarship Winners and report on our Board Meeting. We will have the election of Officers. Our speakers will be Dr. Fayrene Hamouz and Gina Causin from the UNL Hospitality Department. At 3:00, we will meet Governor Heinemann at the Governor's Mansion.

Chief of Staff Reported that she received a thank-you card from Laura and the Scottsbluff VA Home for the hand made Christmas ornaments. She read a thank-you e-mail from the Commander of the USS Nebraska Green Crew, with a photo of the sailors holding the ornaments. The submarine is in port for re-fit.

She also received a new Liability Policy from Barney Insurance, to cover the NAA activities.

Public Affairs officer reported great success with the Christmas ornaments. Nine classes at Reeder Elementary School made them. Vaughn took them to the Veterans Home in Bellevue and delivered them, along with a former employee, to the Veterans Home in Norfolk.

The Quarter Master reported that he ordered 12 XL Polo Shirts and will order 50 logo patches. License plates are selling well. He sold 3 this week. It was suggested that we have the history of the coins on our website.

Selling NAA logo coffee to raise scholarship funds,

was discussed. It was moved and passed that we buy 40 bags of coffee to sell. There should be a #1 favorite, a #2 favorite and decaf. The motion passed.

The Scholarship Officer noted that the candidate interviews will take place in early March.

The Newsletter Editor has announced his retirement from the NAA Board, following the Annual Meeting and publishing the subsequent newsletter.

The Webmaster reported that he has completed a Website Class.

Discussion Items — NAA participation in the 50th Anniversary of Nebraskaland Days in North Platte & the State Fair Parade.

Item of Note: There are only 2 states that have received the **National Tourism Award**. They are Nebraska and Florida.

Financial Report — A Temporary Financial Report was presented due to having not received the Bank Statements until after our April 5, 2014 meeting

Jerry Decker is resigning his Financial Officer position as of June 1, 2014. Vaughn Wiebusch volunteered to take over as the Financial Officer.

The Chief of Staff talked about our Website and Facebook page. She is suggesting that each Board Member's information should be standardized. She handed out a suggestion sheet.

The NAA plans to participate in the Nebraskaland Parade on June $21^{\rm st}$ at 1:00 p.m. and the State Fair Parade on August $22^{\rm nd}$ at 5:00 p.m. The Board agreed to buy 2 magnet signs for a vehicle .

An update on the USS Nebraska **Sailor Visit** revealed that the Sailors will be in Kearney June 18th for about 6 hours. They will speak at YRTC and
