The sailors then said their farewells to the heart of Nebraska and headed down the interstate to the Old West of Nebraska with a few days in North Platte at the rodeo. Reports were received that they had a great time there, as one can imagine!

In mid-September, another crew of sailors from the USS Nebraska (one a native of Omaha!) paid a visit to the "home state", courtesy of the Big Red Sub Club. The BRSC, headquartered in Lincoln and Omaha, provides the opportunity for all the crew members selected by the sub commanders to visit Nebraska, usually one group in June and another group in September of each year. This allows sailors from both the Gold Crew and the Blue Crew opportunities to meet and greet their greatest supporters (after their families, of course!).

The September visit by five sailors started in Beatrice, where they enjoyed visiting Beatrice Baking (the source of the yummy - honest! - fruitcakes the crew enjoys at holiday time!), and other "hot spots" in the Beatrice area, such as DaVinci's and the American Legion.



They enjoyed visiting the Homestead National Monument to learn more about how the West was parceled out. They then went to Nebraska City, where they participated in the AppleJack parade organized by the Gold Star mothers. They got to meet Para Olympian and Nebraska City native Cheri Becarra-Madsen, who had just returned from Rio de Janeiro an hour before the parade! And of course, they got "clearance" to visit Cooper Nuclear Station. One of the very fun experiences they had was at the Nebraska City Fire Fighting Museum, where they slid down the pole, proving they could match firefighters in that skill! (Of course, anyone who's ever been stationed on a sub knows that every crew member on board is trained again and again on firefighting on the sub!) They also visited the G.A.R. (Grand Army of the Republic) Memorial Hall & Civil War Museum, where they learned about 3300 men from Nebraska, about one-third of the state's male population, served in the Civil War.



The sailors' visit wrapped up with a visit to Lake Manawa, across the river in Iowa, where they enjoyed a few hours above water level and a delicious barbeque provided by the Big Red Sub Club. Thank you to all who provided accommodations, meals and activities for the sailors from the USS NEBRASKA!
